Australia's richest billionaire (as of now) and woman has been busy in the last few years expanding her mining business across Western Australia and beyond. Recently, an increased demand for steel and other metals from China has bolstered Hancock Prospecting into one of Australia's foremost mining companies. The company operates largely out of two mines: the Roy Hills mine and the Hope Downs mine, both in the Pilbara region of Western Australia. But the billionaire appears to be a controversial figure in her home country ever since her rise in business, with a large amount of gossip and concern following her over the conflict to take control of the company. Among the other issues that follow her are the treatment of her workers and the policies her company takes. And the website Financial Review notes that she is currently locked in a legal battle with her children over their claims in the company.

Despite the controversy surrounding Rinehart, Hancock Prospecting is on the rise with the boom and with their new mines. And Rinehart is right there at the front with it, maintaining her hold as Australia's richest person while she manages the company.
